As a result of my participation in ancestrally focused creative projects, such as the "My Mother's Daughter" film and Creation/Migration project, in March 2015 I returned to writing and started writing a novel regarding northern New Mexico.

2012-2014

"Big Rose"

Voice Over Artist - I am recording the voice of "Big Rose" exploring various African American community topics for Iris Velasquez, a Santa Fe artist who sculptures large size African American women, in traditional community settings. Her speaking sculptures were exhibited at the Albuquerque Museum from January through April 2014. Her exhibit coincided with the African American Art in the 20th Century travelling exhibit, which presented 100 paintings, sculptures, and photographs by 43 African American artists from the premier collection of the Smithsonian American Art Museum, more than half of which are being shown for the first time.

I am the Voice Over Artist for "Big Rose" by Iris Velasquez. Ms. Velasquez is a Santa Fe artist making life-size speaking figures of African American women in traditional community settings. She exhibited her works at the Albuquerque Museum in January – April 2014, coinciding with the Smithsonian Art Museum's Premier Collection of African American Art in the 20th Century travelling exhibition of 100 paintings, sculptures, and photographs.

"My Mother's Daughter" is a film about both outward and inward journeys, about healing and reconciliation between the African Diaspora and Africans. Act I introduced the film's main characters, the "Heroes" who answer a "call to adventure" and embark on a journey leaving their ordinary lives. Act II will follow the Heroes on the journey to Africa and document the joyous moments, trials, tests and experiences they encounter. Act III will follow the heroes as they "return home with the elixir." What treasures, lessons, and special knowledge will they bring back to enrich their ordinary world at home?

2011

Mining the Unconscious: The Creative Path to Self-Knowledge, Summer 2011, Santa Fe, NM: With the support of the Santa Fe Arts Commission, the New Mexico Committee for the National Museum of Women in the Arts, and the New Mexico Art Therapy Association, this exhibit and accompanying series of lectures, panel discussions, and workshops explored some of the ways in which images from the unconscious play a key role in the creative process.

This was an extraordinary community-based event which stirred the collective imagination of the community of Santa Fe such that the call for artists yielded 150 portfolios for consideration for the art show to be hung at the Santa Fe Community Gallery, an unprecedented number and more than ever received for a gallery exhibit. The level of enthusiasm generated by this exhibit compelled the organizers to create two more exhibit opportunities in gallery spaces in Santa Fe, resulting in 3 exhibits of dynamic expressions of art seeded by mining the unconscious. Each of the exhibits was well attended, with over three hundred people attending the first exhibit at the Community Gallery.

In addition to the art exhibits, over a three-month period in the summer of 2011, twenty-two workshops/lectures were held with subjects including - C.G. Jung's *Red Book*; - *The Labyrinth*; *Dreams*, *I-Ching*, *Speaking to Daemons -in Search of Soul*; and *The Spanish Mustang, an archetype of the West*.
